ITHACA COLLEGE CREW

Ithaca College Rowing completed its 51st year in the spring of 2019. The men's and women's roster totaled almost 80 athletes at the end of the season. The women raced with varsity, second varsity, third varsity, and novice 8's along with a novice 4. The men competed with two 8's, varsity and second varsity, and a third varsity 4. The coaching staffs included **Becky '88** and **Dan Robinson '79**, **Beth Greene '00** (scullers and novice 8), **Rachel Dowd '17** (novices and third varsity 8), **Crista Shopis** (novice men and third varsity 4), **Cat Frank '18** (fall novices), **Mason Averett '14** (scullers and novice women's 4), **Kara Mather** (athletic trainer), **Michael Caruso** (strength training), and **Ward Romer** (a bit of everything!). Commodores for the 2018-19 school year were **Savannah Brija** and **Greta O'Hara** (women's crew), **Jennie Brian** (scullers), and **Adam Nasta** and **Eric Stamer** (men's crew).

FALL 2018 RE-CAP

Notably, summer rowing ended at the World Championships in early September in Bulgaria. Ithaca College Crew was represented by four participants. Eric Frid '14 raced in the U.S. men's heavyweight quad for the second year in a row. Junior Pearl Outlaw (Charlottesville, VA) competed in the U.S. uniform racing the para-double. Manny Delgado Valentin '07 coached the U.S. men's lightweight quad, and Dan Brauchli '15 was present as an administrative official for USRowing. Needless to say, they all came home with stories to tell.

The fall highlights began with the women scullers hosting the Cayuga Sprints, then traveling to the Green Mountain Head, Small Boats Challenge, Bucknell Invitational, Head of the Charles, and Head of the Fish. Senior Savannah Brija won the Small Boat Challenge in Mercer, NJ over 7 other competitors in the 1x. She also finished second at the Fish among 17 racers. Savannah teamed with sophomore **Lauren O'Dell,** to win the 2x at the Cayuga Sprints. Lauren rowed with senior Sierra Keat to capture gold in the 2x at the Fish. Junior **Jennie Brian** won the lightweight 1x at the Fish. Freshman **Dania Bogdanovic** had a pair of third place finishes in the 1x at the Green Mountain Head and the Small Boat Challenge. 2x's rowed by Savannah and Sierra, and Lauren and Dania finished one-two at the Bucknell Invite. At the Head of the Charles, Jennie teamed with junior Pearl **Outlaw**, who is sight impaired, for a third place finish among 9 racers in the "mixed inclusion 2x." Finally, several scullers teamed with sweep oarswomen and placed fourth among 28 in the collegiate 8 at the Charles. It was a good year for the 12-member roster in the 7th season of varsity sculling!

The women sweepers, with a roster of 39, including 21 novices, had their share of positive experiences. With only four juniors (no seniors) this was the development group. They raced at the Head of the Genesee, the Bucknell Invitational, and the Charles (mentioned above). They attempted the Fish, but penguin weather (wet and cold) canceled their afternoon races. Scullers got done in the morning. The sweeps did host a scrimmage with William Smith and also competed in the "Touchdown the Bear, Cornell Classic," now an annual co-ed event hosted by the Big Red including crews from Syracuse, Hobart, and Mercyhurst.

Men's crew started with a highlight by winning the varsity 8 and the freshmen 8 at the Head of the Genesee. The second varsity 8 placed second. The 8's saw their races canceled at the Fish, particularly frustrating since the men did not get an entry into the Charles. Fortunately, we entered two fours into morning races at the Fish, and they both medaled, getting soaked in the process…outdoor sport…I bet you all miss that. The fall season ended traditionally with the Frostbite/Braxton races and a freshmen 8 and 4 won races to bring home medals.

The Freeman cup was contested in nice weather, for Ithaca in November that is; calm water, overcast, light drizzle. The winning crew aboard "Feitner's Ride" had a freshman coxswain **Zoe Foster**. The senior captain of the crew was stroke **Sierra Keat**, followed by **Colin McCarthy**, **Lucas Greenway**, **Jade Hazard**, **Kelsey Lavin**, **Autumn Michels**, **Nicola Vigliotti**, and bow **Spencer Cadley**. SPRING 2019 RE-CAP

Spring season began with the traditional spring break trip, this year to Lake Lanier, GA for the 11th consecutive year, 20 of the last 21. We had good scrimmages vs Marietta, Navy, UNH, and Case Western. Our first race back home was the Cayuga Duals where we hosted six teams and everyone raced twice. The best dual may have been the side-by-side battle between Ithaca's Third Varsity Women's 8 against the Second Varsity 8 from William Smith; the two crews exchanged one-seat leads throughout until the Bomber crew crossed first by 7/10's. Adding to the fun was a freakish gap in the weather....it was warm and beautiful!!

A scheduling highlight was the squad's first ever appearance at the New Jersey Knecht Cup Regatta in mid-April. Featuring heats and semi-finals with 6 crews, five Ithaca 8's made the trip. The weather was great there too. Later season races in Rome, NY and Worcester, MA were marred by cold winds and rain. None-the-less, memorable victories occurred throughout; the Men's crews swept RIT, the Women's Varsity 8 won the petites at the Knecht Cup by beating Boston College and UConn by less than 4/10's, the 2V Men's 8 won a five boat race over WPI, Trinity, Colby, and UNH, and both the Women's V8 and 2V8 won Liberty League races earning them an automatic invitation to the NCAA Championship, their 18th appearance in the 23 years of the regatta.

The New York State Championship, held in Saratoga saw the squad win back the Sandford points trophy from Army. All Ithaca crews made finals and all of the 8's won medals, including golds from the Men's 2V8, Women's 3V8, and the Women's Novice 8. Finally, at the National Invitational Rowing Championship held in Worcester, MA, while it wasn't the best day for the Bombers, we held our own. Our top four crews (V8's and 2V8's) all finished exactly one spot behind their seeded position. The top finish came from the Women's Varsity 8 with a 5th in the grand final. The Men's 4 also made grand finals finishing 6th, the Women's 2V8 won petites (7th overall), the men's 2V8 missed winning petites by 4/10's,

the Novice women finished 10th, the Varsity men finished 12th, and the Women's 3V8 won the third level final to finish 13th overall. Hobart won the top three men's 8 races while Bates was winning the women's varsity and 2V8. By the end of the long day, after non-stop rain and temps in the 30's, the only remaining Ithacans rowing would be the NCAA bound women's crews.

Coaches Becky and Beth accompanied two crews to Indianapolis to join seven other Division III teams (along with six DII and 22 DI teams). There, after all was sorted out, Ithaca's Varsity 8 finished fourth, the 2V8 finished seventh and the result was a fifth place team finish. Bates captured their third consecutive title by winning both the varsity and 2V races. Central Oklahoma won DII and the University of Washington captured the DI crown.
